FIRES MORE THAN 2 METERS AND LESS THAN 4 METERS **PERMIT REQUIRED**

According to By-law 16-RM-05:

10.1 This section applies to fires under sections 10.1 and 10.3 inclusively. No fire is allowed when winds exceed 15km/h or when the flammability index is rated « extreme » by Forest Fire Protection Society « SOPFEU ». The responsibility to check for these conditions falls under the responsibility of the person responsible for the fire, SOPFEU is considered, in regards to the present By-law, as the reference organization and can be contacted at 1-800-567-1206 or www.sopfeu.qc.ca.

10.5 It is forbidden to burn grass, leaves, hay, grass straw, filth, construction waste, petroleum products and other considered pollutants.

10.7 Conditions for issuing a burning permit

The period allowing fires with a permit is from November 1st to April 30 of each year.

The permit is for 30 days.

The conditions for issuing burning permits are based on the authorization form issued by the Fire Department, or any other person duly authorized. This authorization includes all the following conditions that the applicant must meet:

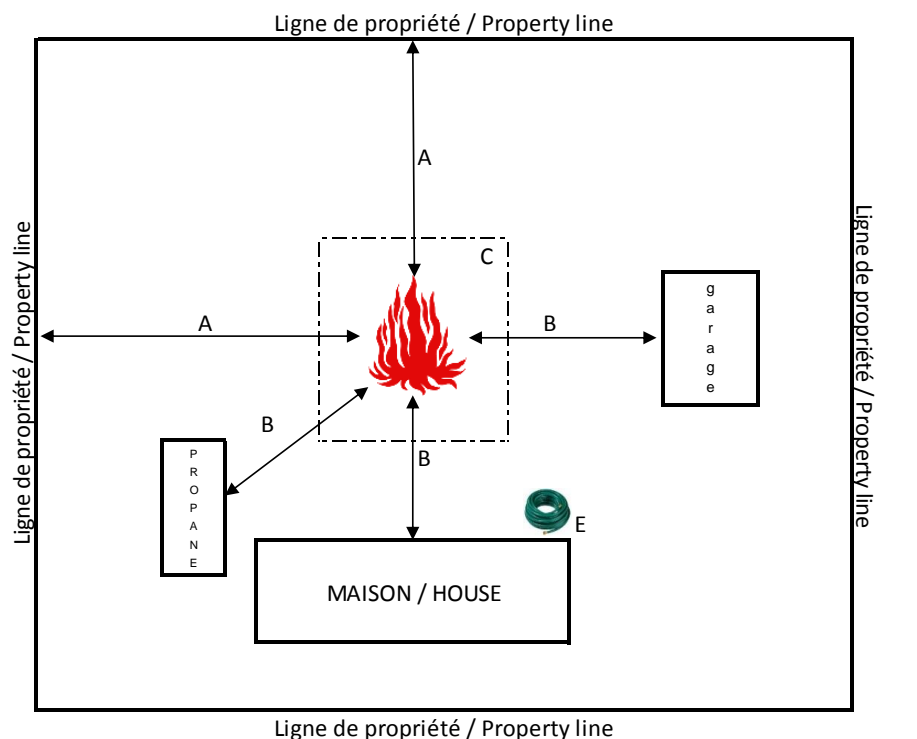
For fire more than 2 meters and less than 4 meters diameter

- Be located at thirty (30) meters (100 ft) from property lines.
- Be located at thirty (30) meters (100 ft) from any building or fuel tanks.
- Have a clearance of fifteen (15) meters (50 ft) from all combustible materials.
- The fire must be under the continuous supervision of the person who has the capacity to respond to the complete extinction of the fire.
- A quick extinguishing media must be accessible within a radius of ten (10) meters (33 ft) of the fire.

Other than the conditions on the authorization form, the applicant for a burning permit has to follow the provisions of sections 10.1 and 10.5 of this By-law.

10.8 Traffic

No one can make a fire affecting road traffic.
