Dear residents of Chelsea,

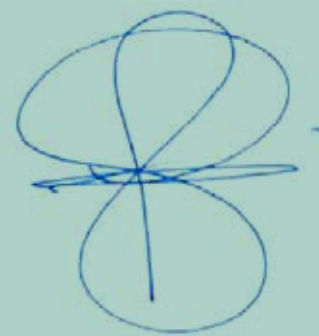
Municipal elections are a key moment in our democratic life. They give each of us the opportunity to choose the individuals who will represent our community and make decisions that impact our daily lives.

Important Dates

Advance Voting

October 26

Election Day

November 2



Who Can Vote?

To vote in municipal elections in Chelsea, you must meet all the following requirements on that date:

- Be registered on the electoral roll
- Be 18 years of age or older
- Be a Canadian citizen
- Not be legally incapacitated under the law or as a result of a court ruling
- Have been a resident of the Municipality of Chelsea and Québec for at least six months.

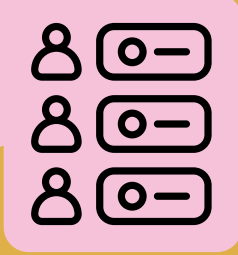
If you are not a resident of Chelsea:

- Own a building in the municipality
- **OR** have operated a business in the municipality for at least twelve months.

4 hours to vote – it’s your right!

Do you work full-time or part-time on Sundays? You’re entitled to four consecutive hours to vote, without losing pay. If your work schedule doesn’t already give you that time off during voting hours your employer must allow it.

Just make sure to talk to them ahead of time!



Identify Yourself to Vote

To vote, you must present:

1. One of the following forms of identification:

- Health insurance card
- Driver’s licence
- Canadian passport
- Certificate of Indian Status
- Canadian Forces ID card

2. Your reminder card

Your reminder card is on the back of the registration notice you received and helps make the election staff’s job easier. It provides the essential information you need to vote, such as the candidates, voting dates, locations, times, and more.

You didn’t receive it?
It’s okay, your ID is sufficient.

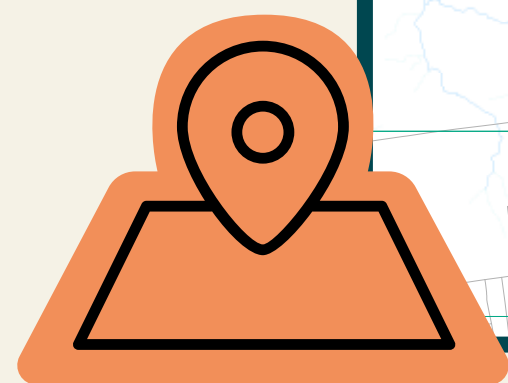
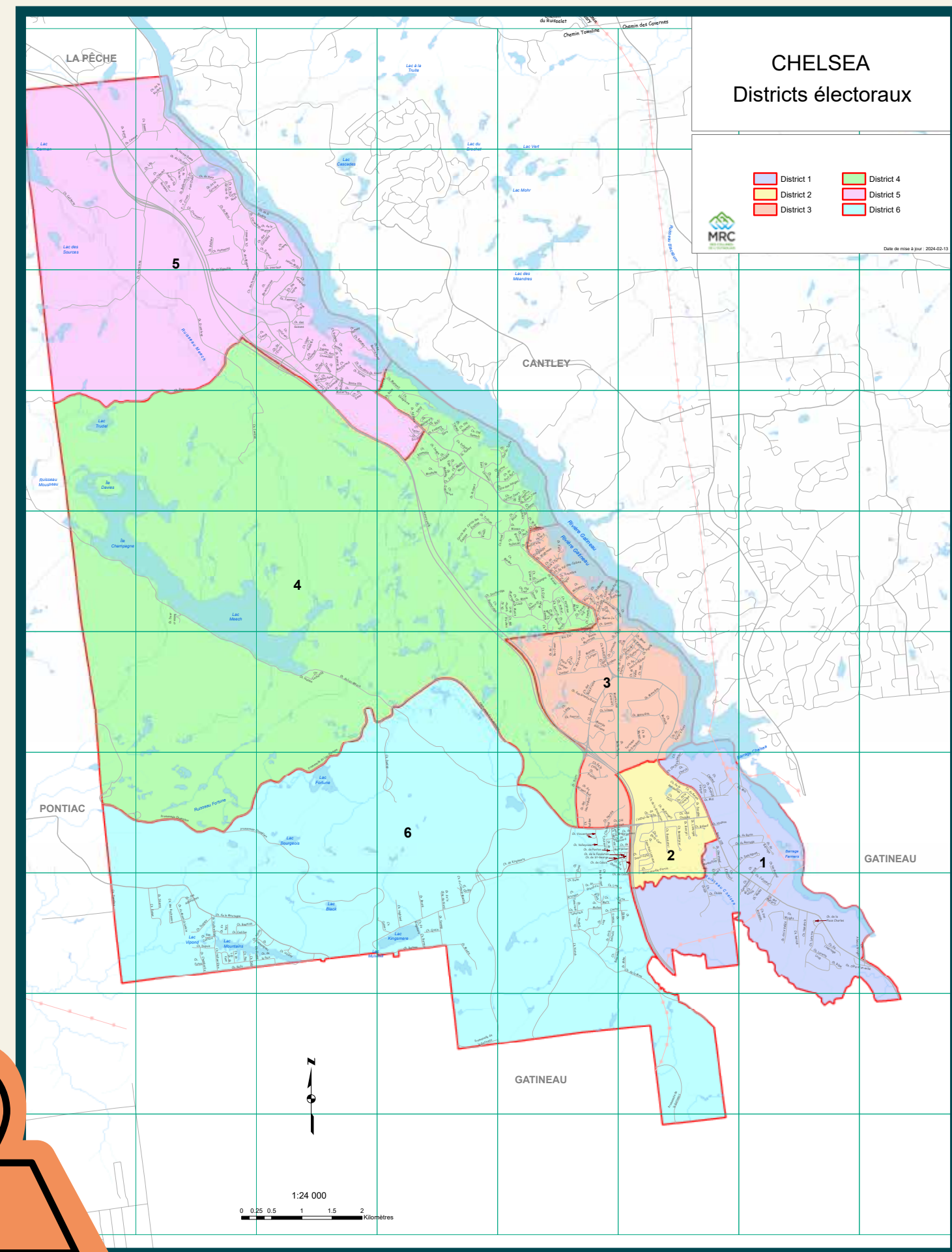

Electoral Map

Make sure your district hasn't changed!

The boundaries of electoral district are revised before each general election to better reflect the current distribution of the population. The current boundaries came into effect in May 2024. This revision resulted in a change of district for certain addresses, particularly in District 2. View the new map at chelsea.ca/electoral-districts.
